TWO OLD RESIDENTS GONE

Mrs. U. Rose

One of the oldest residents of the town and of this part of the County, passed away shortly before midnight on Sunday at her home on Victoria Ave., in the person of Mrs. Cecella Rose, relict of the late Uriah Rose. She was 94 years of age, had been an invalid for a few years past, the result of paralysis, which affected her lower limbs.

She was able to sit up, however, until just recently, and up till last summer was able to be taken out for a ride. The weakness and infirmity of old age, however, were too much to overcome, and for some weeks she gradually got weaker until death took her as above stated. Her maiden name was Cecella Brett, and she was born at Ballymote, County Sligo, Ireland, in 1822, her father being Jasper Brett. When 20 years of age she came to Canada with her brother, the late John Brett, of Amherstburg, and later, Mrs. Catharine Nelson, of Belleville, they settling near Ottawa. She was married at Smith's Falls, Ont., to Uriah Rose, and they moved to Ottawa, where they lived two years, then removing to Kingsville about 1848. Mr. Rose followed farming and lumbering near Kingsville for many years and in the '70's moved to Essex, living here since. Mr. Rose dying in 1895, leaving four children, John A., George, Ellen (deceased), and Ina (Mrs. W. A. Lindsay) of Essex. Ten great grandchildren survive. She was one of seven children, of whom one is now living, Catharine (Mrs. Wm. Nelson) of Belleville. The deceased members are George and Patrick, who died in Ireland; John, who died in Amherstburg; Jane (Mrs. T. Clark) of Ottawa, and Mary (Mrs. Sadler), of Philadelphia. The funeral was held on Wednesday afternoon, services being conducted at the family residence, with interment in Cottam cemetery.

Rev. B. Davies conducted the services, assisted by Rev. A. L. Parnell, and the pall-bearers were Chas. Sweet, Jos. H. Mayville, E. J. Dean, John T. Rogers, E. McCausland and S. F. Her.
